Proceedings

Secretary Chen called the meeting to order at 3:00 pm. She welcomed members and noted that all votes taken during the meeting would be conducted via roll call.

<u>Vote I to approve the 8/8/2023 minutes:</u> Members voted to approve the minutes from the Council's previous meeting on August 8, 2023 by roll-call vote (see detailed record of votes above).

Secretary Chen welcomed a panel of three individuals – Dale Chin, Jun Yang, and David Ho – to share their personal experiences caring for loved ones with dementia. During the discussion, the panelists highlighted a number of challenges in caring for family members with dementia, including the complexity of navigating the health insurance system and lack of awareness about the services and supports insurance covers. They provided examples of the help they received while acknowledging that the support was serendipitously discovered. The panelists, each of Asian descent, highlighted the specific language and cultural barriers that have presented challenges in seeking care for their family members. Panelists emphasized the importance of participating in a caregiver support group to both connect with others experiencing similar challenges and share helpful resources, although not all of them knew about such groups.

All three panelists said they have no one to call in the middle of the night when they need help. Ms. Meehan encouraged them to contact the Alzheimer's Association 24-hour helpline (1-800-272-3900) when in need of support. Members highlighted that the helpline provides support in over 200 languages using phone interpretation services.

Dr. Budson left the meeting at 4:00 pm.

Secretary Chen introduced Patty Sullivan and James Fuccione from the Physical Infrastructure Workgroup to share updates on their group's discussions and recommendations. Mr. Fuccione highlighted the group's accomplishments, which included widespread distribution of the Council's physical infrastructure guide to numerous stakeholders across the state. As part of their presentation, they explained that the workgroup has built partnerships with design, planning, and procurement communities to raise awareness of the importance of age and dementia-friendly design. Ms. Antkowiak and Ms. Pellegrini presented the Care Planning Workgroup's progress and recommendations. Ms. Antkowiak highlighted the group's accomplishments, which included the development of a coded analysis of themes identified through the focus groups that the workgroup previously organized. In addition, the workgroup's newest member, Dr. Rachel Broudy from Ariadne Labs, presented on the development and utilization of person-driven care planning models.
