

# Ames Long Pond, Stoughton/Easton

### **General Information**

Ames Long Pond is an 86-acre pond located west of Route 183 on the Stoughton/Easton town line. It has an average depth of 2.5 feet and a maximum depth of 9 feet. West Street bisects the pond into two basins which are not connected by a navigable passage. Aquatic vegetation is abundant throughout the pond and the shoreline is moderately developed.

### **Recreational Access**

Cartop boat access is available at the town beach on Highland Street (71° 7'4.32"W 42° 4'56.14"N). There is plenty of parking, but you must carry your boat across the beach to the water. The northern basin may be accessed from shore or via cartop boat from West St. (71° 7'2.101"W 42° 5'11.267"N) although parking here is difficult. Please contact the town of Easton for additional information, fee structure, and/or restrictions pertaining to public access of Ames Long Pond.

# **Fish Populations**

The following fish species were found during MassWildlife surveys: Largemouth Bass, Chain Pickerel, Yellow Perch, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Pumpkinseed, Brown Bullhead, Golden Shiner, and American Eel.

## Fishing:

Limited information of fishing on Ames Long Pond suggests good action for Largemouth Bass and Chain Pickerel.
