DECISION

AMESBURY LIQUOR SHOPPE LLC DBA AMESBURY LIQUOR SHOPPE 49 FRIEND STREET AMESBURY, MA 01913 LICENSE#: 002200068

Amesbury Liquor Shoppe LLC dba Amesbury Liquor Shoppe (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 8, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and

2. Investigator Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report dated April 28, 2014.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, April 28, 2014, at approximately 5:35 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Amesbury Liquor Shoppe LLC dba Amesbury Liquor Shoppe.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a twenty five ounce (25 oz.) can of Budweiser Light beer for one dollar and ninety nice cents (\$1.99). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

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CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 - Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
