

2019 Annual Workshop Series for Massachusetts Licensed Timber Harvesters on Ch. 132 Forest Cutting Practices Act Regulations

PURPOSE

The purpose of this workshop series is to provide an opportunity for licensed timber harvesters to receive training on the Ch.132 regulations and to meet their continuing education requirements.

TOPICS

All workshops will have Ch. 132 Rules & Regulations Review and Updates. Individual workshops will feature topics including: Forestry Best Management Practices (BMPs); Silviculture and Fire; Asian Longhorned Beetle (ALB), Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), Gypsy Moth and other DCR Forest Health Program Updates; Reading the Woodland Landscape; Bridges; Ticks and Tick Born Illness Prevention; Natural Heritage and Endangered Species; Markets and Utilization; DCR State Lands Management

CONTINUING EDUCATION CERTIFICATE

Continuing education is incorporated into the timber harvester licensing program in order to build upon licensed timber harvesters' knowledge of Massachusetts forestry laws and regulations and promote responsible timber harvesting. The program requires 9 hours of continuing education credits within 3 consecutive years, 3 hours of which must be on the Massachusetts forestry laws and regulations. Timber harvest related training from other states and organizations may fulfill the remaining 6 credits.

These workshops satisfy the 3 hr requirement for training on the MA forestry laws and regulations.

Participants will be awarded certificates of attendance and are responsible for maintenance of their own records.
