Authority

This hearing was conducted pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 118E, Chapter 30A, and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Jurisdiction

Through notice dated January 24, 2022, MassHealth notified the appellant that his coverage will change to MassHealth Senior Buy In because his assets are too high to get MassHealth Standard (Exhibit 1). The appellant timely appealed this notice, and the hearing was scheduled for March 17, 2022 (Exhibits 1 and 2). At the conclusion of the hearing, the record was held open for the appellant to submit verification that his assets had been reduced (Exhibit 3). After reviewing the additional documentation, MassHealth notified the parties that the appellant's assets were reduced to within the MassHealth program limits, and that the case has now been approved (Exhibit 4).

The appeal is therefore appropriately dismissed (130 CMR 610.035(A)(8)).
