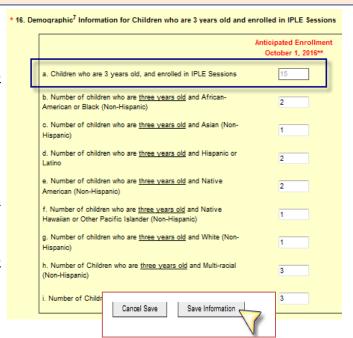

A **Part Day Session** refers to a session that meets fewer than four (4) hours per day, for at least 2 or more days per week). **School Day Session** refers to a session that meets at least four (4) hours per day, but fewer than six (6) hours per day for at least 2 or more days per week), and an **Extended day session** refers to a session that meets six (6) or more hours per day for at least 2 or more days per week.
