A. Requirements and Instructions

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) describes amateur radio operators as people who “are qualified persons of any age who are interested in radio technique solely with a personal aim and without pecuniary interest.” Ham radio operators maintain and operate radio communications for the purpose of self-training, intercommunication, and technical investigations. Operation of an amateur station requires an amateur operator license from the FCC.

“Ham Radio Operator” registration plates can only be issued to persons with an active FCC license.

Instructions:

1. Complete and sign application.
2. Mail the completed application, a copy of your FCC license, a completed Registration and Title Application (RTA) including insurance company stamp, and a \$40 check or money order (\$20 for the plates and a \$20 swap fee) payable to MassDOT to the address at the top of the form. It may take up to 60 days from the date of the application for the plates to be manufactured.
