



## February Precipitation & Departures

Accumulated Precipitation (inches) March 01, 2025 to April 01, 2025







4-6" inch totals for most of the Commonwealth

Departures were generally within linch of normal


## 3 and 6 Month Percent of Normal



## Last 3 Months (Dec-Feb)

- Near normal (80-120%) across eastern/southeastern MA
- Below normal (40-80%) across western MA and Cape/Islands


Precipitation Percent of Normal October 01, 2024 to April 01, 2025




## Last 6 Months (Sep-Feb)

- Mostly below normal (60-100 percent)
- Localized 40-60% western MA and ACK

#### 3-5 Degrees Above Normal




## 7 Day Precipitation Forecast

Through Mon April 14th




- Includes Monday/Tuesday Precip

- Most will come from a Friday/Saturday rain event




## Outlook: Apr 12 – Apr 16



### Odds favor above normal precipitation and near or below normal temperatures







## Outlook: Apr 19 – May 2



No strong signal for above/below normal temperature or precipitation






# Outlook for Apr, May, Jun



Odds favor above normal temperatures with no clear signal for above/below normal precipitation





March: Above normal temperatures and near normal precipitation

- Precipitation was generally slightly below to slightly above normal (4-6 inches) for March
- Temperatures were 3 to 5 degrees above normal on average

#### Longer Range Precipitation Departures:

• 3-month and 6-month departures continue to show longer term dryness with 6 month PON ranging from 40 to 80 percent of normal across The Commonwealth

#### Outlook:

• I to 2" of new precipitation possible through early next week with the best chances across western MA

No signal for above or below normal precipitation in the extended outlooks beyond 10 days
