A meeting of the Criminal Record Review Board (CRRB) was held on Thursday, April 26, 2018 at 10:00 a.m., in the second floor conference room of the Massachusetts Information Technology Center, located at 200 Arlington Street, Chelsea, Massachusetts.

Board Business:

At approximately 10:00 a.m., a quorum was present. Acting Chairperson Koulouris called the meeting of the CRRB to order.

Approval of January 11, 2018 CRRB Meeting Open Session Minutes:

After reviewing the open meeting minutes from the January 11, 2018 CRRB meeting, Dr. Rhiana Kohl made a motion to accept the minutes. Susanne Reardon seconded the motion. The motion passed by a majority vote of 7-0, with Acting Chairperson Koulouris, Captain Rebeiro, Tara Maguire, Michael Callahan and Carmen Gomez¹ abstaining from voting.

<u>Update on Criminal Justice Reform Bill</u>

Acting Chairperson Koulouris gave the Board an update on the Criminal Justice Reform Bill and its impact on the Board and DCJIS regulations. Acting Chairperson Koulouris advised the Board that an earlier meeting may be called to discuss the possible amendments to the DCJIS regulations.

Executive Session:

At this point in the meeting, Acting Chairperson Koulouris indicated the Board would be entering into Executive Session to review CORI complaints whose subject matter is protected pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30A, § 21(a)(7) and M.G.L. c. 6, §172. A motion to enter executive session was made by Michael Callahan and seconded by Thomas Capasso. A roll-call vote was taken, and the motion passed 10-0 with Acting Chairperson Koulouris abstaining from voting. The Board entered executive session at 10:10 a.m.

At the end of all discussion, Acting Chairperson Koulouris indicated that the Board should exit Executive Session. Susanne Reardon made a motion to exit executive session. Michael Callahan seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously 10 - 0. The executive session ended at approximately 11:00 a.m. George Klier then made a motion to adjourn. Tara Maguire seconded the motion it passed unanimously 10-0. The meeting adjourned at approximately 11:05 a.m.
