Participants David Gleich from the Boston Housing Authority, Complainant Dawn Oates, a disability advocate, Joshua Oftring of the Boston Housing Authority, and Michael Muehe from the BCIL are sworn in. Exhibit #1 AAB 1-51 and Exhibit #2 a PowerPoint presentation are noted. Dawn Oates begins by giving an overview of the ongoing problems at the Ruth Barkley Apartment complex and other BHA properties. She recounts numerous times she personally was trapped in the elevators at 42 Harrison Archway and other instances shared with her by residents. She argues that there are problems across BHA properties. She urges the Board to stop allowing time relief. James N. Worden, BHA counsel, offers a response and describes their bidding process. David Gleich goes over a presentation which highlights work being done, to be done, invoicing, and the work order for all BHA sites.
