We take this incident and the security of your personal information on our systems very seriously. As a precaution, we are providing you with access to resources, including complimentary identity monitoring, so that you may better safeguard your personal information, should you feel it appropriate to do so.

The confidentiality, privacy, and security of information on our systems is one of our highest priorities. DHC has taken and is taking steps to review its policies, procedures and existing security measures.

As an added precaution, and at no cost to you, we arranged to have Kroll provide identity monitoring for 24 months. While DHC will cover the cost of these services, you will need to complete the activation process.

To activate Kroll's identity monitoring services, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Visit https://enroll.idheadquarters.com to activate.
- 2. You have until << Date>> to activate your identity monitoring services. Your membership number will not work after this date.
- 3. Provide your personal information to Kroll, as requested.
- 4. Provide the following Membership Number: << Member ID>>.

We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review your account statements, and to monitor your credit reports for suspicious activity. Under U.S. law you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. You may also contact the three major credit bureaus directly to request a free copy of your credit report.

You have the right to place a "security freeze" on your credit report, which will prohibit a consumer reporting agency from releasing information in your credit report without your express authorization. The security freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a security freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in your credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a security freeze on your credit report. In order to request a security freeze, you will need to provide the following information:

- 1. Your full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
- 2. Social Security number;
- 3. Date of birth;
- 4. If you have moved in the past five (5) years, provide the addresses where you have lived over the prior five years;
- 5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
- 6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, military identification, etc.);
- 7. If you are a victim of identity theft, include a copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft.

As an alternative to a security freeze, you have the right to place an initial or extended "fraud alert" on your file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a 1-year alert that is placed on a consumer's credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer's credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer's identity before extending new credit. If you are a victim of identity theft, you are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years.
