

Ed Kelly, President/CEO, MRMC and Doug Brown, President, UMass Memorial Community Hospitals and Chief Administrative Officer were introduced to the committee and gave an update on the UMass Memorial Health/Milford Regional Corporate Affiliation.

- Ed Kelly has been at MRMC for 31 years. During this period, MRMC has been a growing system with a large physician practice. Their academic partners include UMass Memorial, Children's Hospital, Brigham and Women's Hospital and Dana Farber Cancer Institute.

- Doug Brown discussed the great relationship between UMMH and MRMC over the last 30 years.
 - o Currently, there is a brutal environment in healthcare.
 - Over the next five years, he sees more changes than the previous 50 years as a result of technology and artificial intelligence
 - Plan to install Epic, a cloud-based electronic health records system for hospitals. UMMH has received a top score in installing EPIC
 - The corporate affiliation will be similar to the agreement with Harrington Hospital approximately 2 years ago
