Area Need Improvement	At one location one of two incident reportable incidents was not filed in HCSIS. The agency needs to ensure that all reportable incidents are filed in HCSIS as required within the required timelines.
Process Utilized to correct and review indicator	All AEI incidents are entered into Accreditation Now software, and all HCSIS reportable incidents are additionally entered into that software. Failure to report incidents within the required timelines has been reviewed with the Director of Family Supports, and ensuring reporting incidents in a timely fashion is one of the performance objectives on the Directors performance evaluation form. HCSIS reporting requirements have been reviewed with all program staff.
Status at follow-up	Since January 1 of this year, there have been 26 reportable HCSIS Incidents throughout all AEI programs, each of which has been entered into HCSIS within required timelines.

Area Need Improvement	Four of sixteen restraint reports were no reviewed by the Human Rights Committee within 120 days as required. The agency needs to ensure that all restraint reports are reviewed by the Human Rights Committee within 120 days of occurrence.
Process Utilized to correct and review indicator	All restraints are entered into Accreditation Now software and HCSIS software programs. Failure to enter restraint reports into HCSIS in a timely fashion has been reviewed with the Program Director. This failure resulted in the Human Rights Committee not reviewing the cited restraints. The Human Rights Committee is meeting later this month and will review the restraints, although as stated, this did not occur within 120 days of occurrence. Reporting restraints in HCSIS in a timely fashion is now a performance objective for the Director's performance evaluation
Status at follow-up	The Human Rights Coordinator has reviewed all restraints posted on HCSIS this year, and the Human Rights Committee will review them at their meeting later this month, within the required 120 days of occurrence.
