Dear Colleague,

The Massachusetts Department of Mental Health and the MassHealth Pharmacy Program are writing to enlist your help and cooperation.

Behavioral health medications account for nearly \$190 million, or 37% of the total annual MassHealth pharmacy budget. Atypical antipsychotics represent over \$93 million, or 18.5% of the annual pharmacy costs. Over 6,000 members receive more than one atypical antipsychotic for 60 days (time allowed for tapering), at a cost of over \$10 million per year.

MassHealth, in partnership with DMH, has identified several prescribing practices that, if adopted, will improve patient care while reducing costs. We strongly encourage you to voluntarily adopt these practices.

Start Now

The Department of Mental Health and the MassHealth Pharmacy Program, in consultation with a group of psychopharmacology experts and experienced clinicians, recommend immediate implementation of the following interventions.

- 1. Reduce the use of brand-name antipsychotics by starting or, when appropriate, changing patients to generic therapies.
- 2. Reduce the simultaneous prescribing of two or more atypical antipsychotics for the same patient.
- 3. Reduce the use of four, five, six, and even seven behavioral health medications for the same patient at the same time (often independent of "medical" medications).

In addition to adopting clinical strategies, every practitioner must consider whether there are less costly, effective treatments available. (Please see attached list of frequently prescribed behavioral health medications and their cost.)

In addition, at the end of this fiscal year, the MassHealth Pharmacy Program and DMH expect to consider whether alternative interventions, such as a more expansive priorauthorization program, are needed in order to ascertain the medical necessity of prescribed drugs.


