Honorable Chairs and Ranking Minority Members of the Committees on Ways and Means:

Pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Laws¹, the Department of Revenue (DOR) hereby submits its mid-month tax revenue report for the month of August 2018, the second month of fiscal year 2019. The attached table shows August 2018 month-to-date tax revenue collections through August 15, 2018, along with changes from the equivalent period in August 2017.

Revenue collections are uneven and weighted toward month-end, and the brief period covered in the midmonth does not provide sufficient data for comparison to prior years. **Therefore, the Department strongly urges that mid-month figures should not be used to assess trends or project future revenues.**

Context for August estimates

August is one of the smaller months for revenue collection, because neither individual nor business taxpayers make significant estimated payments during the month. On average for the past several years, roughly 6.7% of annual revenue has been received during August.

Highlights

- **Total Tax** collections for the month-to-date period were \$746 million, up \$38 million or 5.4% versus the same period in August 2017.
- **Income Taxes** totaled \$555 million, up \$24 million or 4.6% versus the same period in August 2017.
- Sales & Use Tax collections were \$109 million, up \$16 million or 17.3% versus the same period in August 2017.
- **Corporate & Business Taxes** were \$13 million, down \$6 million or 30.7% versus the same period in August 2017. August is a minor month for business tax revenues.
- Other Taxes totaled \$69 million, up \$4 million or 5.5% versus the same period in August 2017.

Detail

Total Income Tax of \$555 million for mid-month August comprises the following:

- **Withholding** of \$545 million, up \$29 million from mid-month August 2017.
- Estimated Payments of \$11 million, up \$0.1 million from mid-month August 2017.
- **Returns/Bills** of \$15 million, down \$10 million from mid-month August 2017.
- **Refunds** of \$16 million, down \$5 million from mid-month August 2017. Because refunds are an outflow, this represents a positive variance from the prior year.

Sales & Use Tax collections of \$109 million for the August month-to-date period are \$16 million or 17.3% more than the equivalent period last year. Only a small proportion of expected Regular Sales and Meals remittances are received by the mid-month date; the bulk of these payments are expected on or after the 20th of the month.

- \$50 million in Regular Sales Tax collections, up \$12 million from mid-month August 2017.
- \$16 million in Meals Tax revenues, up \$2 million from mid-month August 2017.
- \$42 million in Motor Vehicle Sales Tax revenues, up \$1 million from mid-month August 2017.

Corporate & Business tax revenues were \$13 million, down \$6 million from mid-month August 2017.

All Other includes a number of tax categories including motor fuels, cigarettes, estate taxes, and deeds. All other revenues were \$69 million, up \$4 million from mid-month August 2017.

Because collections are weighted to the end of the month, we do not use the mid-month figures to project full-month revenue. Comparisons to prior-year periods are unreliable because of normal fluctuations and calendar differences in the short 15-day window of incremental data.
