DECISION

AYER PACKAGE STORE INC. D/B/A AYER PACKAGE STORE 48 MAIN STREET AYER, MA 01432

Ayer Package Store Inc. d/b/a Ayer Package Store ("Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission ("ABCC" or "Commission") held a remote hearing via Microsoft Teams on Tuesday, July 26, 2022, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. Ch. 138, § 34 Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one years of age (1 count). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the facts alleged in Investigator David's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator David's Report;
- 2. Photograph of Fraudulent Identification Confiscated;
- 3. ABCC Form 43 License Renewal Approval, 12/12/1963;
- 4. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.
- A. Massachusetts Package Store Association Inc.'s Beverage Alcohol Training Certificates for Five (5) Employees.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On Thursday, May 12, 2022, at approximately 10:55 p.m., Investigators Keefe, Quinn, and David ("Investigators") inspected Ayer Package Store Inc. d/b/a Ayer Package Store to determine the manner in which its business was being conducted.
- Investigators observed a youthful appearing individual exit the store in possession of a case
 of White Claw Hard Seltzer. Investigators approached the individual, identified
 themselves and asked to see proof of legal age to purchase and/or possess alcoholic
 beverages.

- 3. Underage #1, actual date of birth 9/24/2001 (age 20), admitted he was under 21 years of age and presented to Investigators a fraudulent Connecticut driver's license in his name but with a different birthdate. He informed Investigators that he used the fraudulent identification to purchase the alcoholic beverages.
- 4. Investigators entered the licensed premises, informed the clerk on duty of the violation and that a report would be filed with the Chief Investigator for further review.
- 5. The Licensee has held a license under M.G.L. c. 138, § 15 before 1963 with no prior violations.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated M.G.L. Ch. 138, § 34 Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one years of age (1 count). As a result, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
