1. Review \Vote approval of ESS June 16, 2022 meeting minutes.

A staff reviewed copy of the minutes were not available to be distributed to the board, this item was tabled to the 7/12 meeting. A vote was not taken.

2. Review \Vote 10th edition proposed amendments for Ch. 3, 4 and 10 submitted by the Fire Protection and Fire Prevention Technical Advisory Committee.

The board began reviewing Chapter 3 in the proposed amendments changes (Exhibit A) as presented by Michael Roescher. Section 310.4 was discussed in depth as to the practicality in enforcement of the proposed changes. After a look at a few clarifying language changes, John Lebeaux, indicated that if the proposed changes are implemented agricultural businesses will have to augment their practices to a point of major detriment to the business.

Michael Roescher suggested switching to chapter 10 as there was less proposed changes that needed to be made to allow additional time for review. A fulsome discussion was had regarding delayed egress systems and fire sprinklers in Section 10.10.2.13. A **Motion** was made by John Couture to move Chapter 10 to public review without any strike-outs, but with an amendment to section 907 for alarm/ smoke detection to be properly installed along with delayed locking egress systems. The motion was Seconded by Mike McDowell. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Darien Crimmin voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **NO**. The motion **PASSED** 9/1.

Chapter 4 was deliberated in depth as to which version of proposed amendments should be used, as there is FPFP proposed amendments and a version that was voted on by the BBRS board and reviewed by HED. After the deliberation, a **Motion** was made to move Chapter 4 with the FPFP amendments to public comment with any accepted HED amendments by Michael McDowell. The motion was **Seconded** by John Couture. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Darien Crimmin voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **NO**. The motion **PASSED** 9/1.

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As chapter 4 and 10 had been addressed the board moved back to reviewing chapter 3. After additional clarifying questions a **Motion** was made by David Riquinha to change the language under the heading F1 from the word "Agriculture" to "Cannabis" and was **Seconded** by Mike McDowell. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Darien Crimmin voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **NO**. The motion **PASSED** 9/1. Another **Motion** was made by David Riquinha to accept all the other proposed changes in the chapter and was **Seconded** by Mike McDowell. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **NO**, Darien Crimmin voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **YES**. The motion **PASSED** 9/1.

3. Review \Vote Proposed edits for Chapter 4 and R3 from HED

Counsel presented a new version of the indoor agriculture portion of Chapter 4 showing all proposed changes requested by HED, which he noted did involve making the indoor agriculture section explicit to cannabis. Counsel noted that the indoor agriculture section appeared to have some copyrighted text imbedded, he will make an update to that and to the numbering of the section for use in the final draft. A **Motion** was made by David Riquinha to accept the changes in chapter 4 of the HED proposed edits (Exhibit B). The motion was seconded by John Couture. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Darien Crimmin voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **YES**. The motion passed **Unanimously**.

The FPFP proposed Amendments of Chapter 4 was brought up again indicating that language changes had been made in piecemeal and should be incorporated by FPFP. A **Motion** was made by David Riquinha to accept chapter 4 amendments with an understanding that indoor growth structures should be merged with indoor agriculture, and the edits made within section 433 beyond what the BBRS has already approved would not be accepted, and the motion was **Seconded** by Mike McDowell. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael

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McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **NO**, Steve Fredrickson voted **NO**, Tarica Leskiw **ABSTAINED**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **NO**, and Jen Hoyt voted **YES**. The motion **PASSED** 4/3.

Counsel presented a new version of R3 showing all proposed changes requested by HED, which he noted were largely stylistic/grammatical. A **Motion** was made by Mike McDowell to have the R3 amendments submitted for public comment. The motion was **Seconded** by John Couture A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **YES**. The motion passed **Unanimously**.

4. Review \Vote Proposed edits for Chapter 18 from Geotechnical Advisory Committee.

Rob Anderson provided a background on the proposed amendments for Chapter 18 (Exhibit C) and explained that ground improvement is not regulated as much as other construction focuses. The proposed provisions are intended to make the work for employees safer. A **Motion** was made by Mike McDowell to approve Chapter 18 and was **Seconded** by John Couture. A **Roll Call** vote was made where David Riquinha voted **YES**, Michael McDowell voted **YES**, John Couture voted **YES**, Steve Fredrickson voted **YES**, Tarica Leskiw voted **YES**, Atiya Rahim voted **YES**, Richard Baldacci voted **YES**, and Jen Hoyt voted **YES**. The motion passed **Unanimously**.
