2. Approval of minutes from 1/24/25

Ian Finlayson made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Mark Durrenberger. Motion passed unanimously.

Approval of minutes from 3/14/25

Ian Finlayson made a motion to approve the minutes subject to staff correction regarding the identity of the motion maker seeking adjournment, seconded by Mark Durrenberger. Motion passed unanimously.

- 3. Work product to be created by this subcommittee
  - a. Proposed amendments to the 10<sup>th</sup> edition of the building code regarding solar installations

Luke McKneally presented doc for continued review and edits – BBRS-PV\_Chapter-R326\_2025.03.19\_CodeChange Language DRAFT. Mark Durrenberger suggested edits to Section R 324.6.3 Access Pathways to correct wording.

Jake Nunnemacher suggested edits for proposed language on roof access and pathways. Cross references were also discussed. Board Counsel weighed in with correct format and noted that review of doc to confirm proper language for all references in the proposal would not be a problem, will take place offline prior to submission. There was robust discussion on exception language of occupiable vs non-habitable (changed to structures without habitable spaces), obstructions, and language about approval authority.

Setbacks at Ridge and discussion about PV arrays occupying up 33 or 50% of the plan view roof area ensued. Members crafted language in an attempt to reach consensus, including addressing legal counsel's concerns regarding authorities having jurisdiction as well as industry concerns.

Industry members discussed accepting the adjusted percentage as shown on screen (50) in 324.6.4.1/4.2 and alternatives in 324.6.5. Further points made by Jacob Nunnemacher regarding the perspective of the fire industry in discussion.

A motion was made by Sam Pillsbury, seconded by Mark Durrenberger to approve the draft. A roll call vote was taken. Objections from Chief Ferschke and Jacob Nunnemacher. Approvals from Luke McKneally, Mark Durrenberger, Ian Finlayson, Sam Pillsbury. Motion passed by a vote of 4 to 2.

Jacob Nunnemacher made a motion to send this document to BBRS for review with staff updating the reference formatting, seconded by Ian Finlayson. A brief discussion was held. Luke McKneally will forward to staff the finalized document and code change proposal form with changes. Staff will finalize the formatting of references and send to the BBRS.
