Appellant: David Roberto

Property Address: 20 Linwood Street, Marshfield, MA. 02050

Summary of Case: Appellants sought relief from 780 CMR R102.8.1, R105.1, R105.3.1.1,

R107.1, R109.3, R110.1, R111.1.1, 110.R5.1.2, with respect to an existing building.

Jake Nunnemacher made a MOTION that was SECONDED by Jeffrey Clemons, to UPHOLD the Building Officials ruling of 780 CMR R105.3.1.1 for substantial renovations and to GRANT relief to 780 CMR R322.2.1 contingent on: 1) appellant provides hydrostatic vents. 2) appellant must elevate the utility and existing equipment to the appropriate heights. 3) Fill crawlspace to the approval of the Building Commissioner. It is also noted that there was no opposition from the Building Department and DCR. The Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Jeffrey Clemons made a **MOTION** that was **SECONDED** by Jake Nunnemacher, to **GRANT** an extension of the previously approved accreditation of CCRL as required by **780 CMR 110.R1.4**, with a six (6) month extension from today.

Jeffrey Clemons made a **MOTION** that was **SECONDED** by Michael McDowell, to **OVERTURN** the Building Officials ruling of **2021 IRC Chapter 2**, **Section R202** in that this does not meet the definition of an accessory building. The Motion was approved by a 2-1 vote, Jake Nunnemacher was opposed.
