The Board discussed the following:

Meeting Called to Order at 9:02a.m.

 The Board reviewed and discussed Mr. DiBiase's request for reconsideration of his 11/24/2020 application denial decision. Mr. DiBiase stated to the Board he has been working in the state of Rhode Island for the past 25 years and all his employees have worked under his license as elevator mechanic apprentices. Due to the requirements per M.G.L. c. 143 §71, Mr. DiBiase stated it would put his stairlift/residential vertical platform lift install compnay out of business, as they are unable to service any Massachusetts customers. Yet, Massachusetts elevator mechanics are able to work in Rhode Island. After further discussion, a motion was made by Walter Zalenski to deny Mr. DiBiase's request for reconsideration with the justification that it is clearly stated in M.G.L. c. 143 §7, among other requirements, an applicant is required to "...furnish documentary proof satisfactory to the board, from his registered joint apprentice committee or his current or previous employer or employees engaged primarily in the business of erecting, constructing, installing, altering, testing, repairing or maintaining elevators, escalators, moving walks and other related conveyance equipment, that he has worked not less than 6,000 on-the-job-training hours over a period of not less than 3 years as an elevator constructor apprentice, under the <u>direct and immediate field</u> <u>supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic in the commonwealth</u>", and Mr. DiBiase's 11/20/2020 application failed to meet these provisions. The motion was seconded by George Dahlquist.
