Background: This announcement solicits applications for the FY 2016 Behavioral Health

Workforce Education and Training (BHWET) for Paraprofessionals and Professionals program. In support of the White House's *Now is the Time* initiative, the program aims to expand the mental health and substance abuse workforce serving children, adolescents, and transitional-age youth at risk for developing or who have a recognized behavioral health disorder. Grant recipients will be expected to expand the behavioral health workforce by supporting education and clinical training for behavioral health-related professionals and paraprofessionals. BHWET grant recipients will help to close the gap in access to behavioral health care services by increasing the numbers of adequately prepared behavioral health providers entering and continuing practice with at-risk children, adolescents, and transitional-age youth. Also, establish partnerships with a wide range of organizations and community partners to assure recruitment of students from diverse backgrounds, provide opportunities for field placements, career
