An Oasis for Birds

Discover osprey, swallows, egrets and other specialty birds on a leisurely one-mile walk over flat, easy terrain at this MA State Park & Birding Hotspot, as well as other nearby locations we'll visit. You are responsible for your own transportation between locations by car or bike. Please leave pets at home. Binoculars recommended, some loaner binoculars will be available thanks to the Friends of Belle Isle Marsh. Morning at the Marsh

Start your day off at Belle Isle Marsh Reservation! As we make our way around the reservation, we will be mindful of the sounds around us – the calls of birds, along with the subway starting its first runs of the day and airplanes going overhead; reminders that the reservation is truly an oasis in the heart of the city. We'll keep an eye out for birds, mammals like eastern cottontail rabbits, and will also take in the beauty of the reservation's trees and other vegetation. Binoculars suggested, some loaner binoculars will be available thanks to the Friends of Belle Isle Marsh. Insect repellent strongly recommended due to the presence of mosquitoes and ticks.
