**DECISION**

**SGBSYP LLC DBA FIELDS WINE & SPIRITS**

**HEARING HELD: 1/24/2012**

SGBSYP LLC dba Fields Wine & Spirits (the "Licensee") holds an all-alcoholic beverages license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, January 24, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Dennis Keefe's Compliance Check Field Report.

**FACTS**


1. On Wednesday, August 17, 2011, at approximately 6:17 p.m., Commission Investigators Keefe and Kujawski conducted an investigation of the licensed premises of SGBSYP LLC dba Fields Wine & Spirits.
2. An underage operative, working with the Investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a forty (40) ounce bottle of Miller High Life beer, for two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

**CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
