DECISION

VB BEER & WINE INC. D/B/A PENGUIN CONVENIENCE STORE 829 SOUTH MAIN STREET BELLINGHAM, MA 02019 LICENSE#: 008600059

VIOLATION DATE: 05/18/2016 HEARING DATE: 11/08/2016

VB Beer & Wine Inc. d/b/a Penguin Convenience Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) — Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 — Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Keefe's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 18, 2016;
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- On Wednesday, May 18, 2016, at approximately 6:54 p.m., Investigators Di Cicco and Keefe investigated the business operation of VB Beer & Wine Inc. d/b/a Penguin Convenience Store.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage for two dollars and seventy-five cents (\$2.75). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
