 2 Washington Square - Worcester, MA [Exhibit 1 and 1A] New Installation
 524 CMR A17.1-2013 Section 2.1.5 Petitioner: Christopher Sullivan

The petitioner was in front of the Board proposing to install three new elevators that would require a variance from A17.1-2013 Section 2.1.5, which prohibits windows in hoistway walls or elevator cars. The petitioner stated that in accordance with the 2006

settlement agreement with the Boston Center for Independent Living, the MBTA is required to maximize transparency of elevators to promote safety by means of visibility. The petitioner stated that there is no requirement for the elevator shafts themselves to be fire resistant. The only place that a separation may be required would be at the lower level of elevator #1, where it comes down into the lobby space, and the shaft will be enclosed. Also, there will be cameras in the elevators. The petitioner submitted additional supporting documentation and the file was transmitted to the Board (Exhibit 1A). Acting Chairman Eric Morse stated that in his opinion, the hoistway as designed, meets the requirements of Section 2.1.1.2, which is non-fire resistant construction, and the variance the petitioner is requesting is not applicable because what was presented are not windows, based on the definition in A17.1. The Board stated that the petitioner should determine if there are additional code sections that might require a variance. The petitioner requested to withdraw his request to allow for further examination. There was no objection by the Board. Withdrawn.

# 2. Review work to finalize draft decisions and continue discussion for 10 Park Plaza [Exhibit 2]
