1. 30 Penniman Road – Allston, MA [Exhibit 1] Product Variance Product: Lift-Sliding Semi-Automated Parking System Manufacturer: ParkPlus Petitioner: Ted Makowski

The Board continued discussion regarding a product variance request for the allowance to install an automated parking device to be located at the above address. The petitioner's representative, Brandon Hall was originally in front of the Board on February 4, 2020 seeking a product variance for a 42-car tandem lift-sliding semi-automated parking system to be installed at the above location. Mr. Hall presented to the Board additional documentation and requested clarification of the stance of the petition as it stands today. Board member Jacob Nunnemacher stated that the concern for Fire Service is that if there is a fire, or an event down in the pit, the Fire Department will have to go through an access ladder. Mr. Nunnemacher acknowledged that Mr. Hall has improved the situation by moving the hatch to the front of the system versus at the rear of the unit. Mr. Nunnemacher stated that the problem remains that you still have to open the hatch and go down an open hatch to fight a fire and that is an extremely dangerous situation for a firefighter to be in and that is the reason the Board is looking for a door in the pit. Mr. Hall stated that at this time there cannot be any design changes to the foundation. Board member Brian Ronan pointed out to Mr. Hall that the project at the above address has not been issued a full building permit. The permit currently issued for the project is considered an "At will" building permit, which has been mentioned to Mr. Hall numerous times at various Elevator Regulations meetings. Board member David Gaudet advised Mr. Hall that on a previous Board hearing in May, Mr. Hall was notified by the Board to provide a detailed plan of the pit access including access paths, clearances and hatch dimensions, including details of the first floor and pit, citing 524 CMR A17.1-2013 Section 2.2.4. Mr. Nunnemacher also mentioned a concern of the proposed fire suppression system that Mr. Hall presented in his variance request. Mr. Nunnemacher stated that the fire sprinkler systems are not designed to extinguish the fire but are there to control the fire until Fire Service can get down to fight the fire. Now coupled with the advent of newer technology, if there are electric cars, hydrogen fuel vehicles etc., makes

the situation even more complicated and more necessary for safe pit access. Ashley Johann Jenkins stated that the opening to access the pit can be made larger. A motion was placed by David Gaudet to take this matter under advisement for closed session to discuss further. The motion was seconded by David Morgan. Board member Brian Ronan will conduct a site visit and follow-up with Deputy Fire Chief Brian P. Tully Sr. of the Boston Fire Department.

2. Old Business:

• 291 Saint Botolph Street – Boston, MA Product Variance Petitioner: Daniel Collins

The petitioner was in front of the Board on June 23, 2020 seeking a product variance to replace the existing car fan with a fan that has UV light incorporated to sterilize the air as it circulates. The petitioner requested to withdraw his variance request. No action taken and the variance request is considered withdrawn.

174 Ipswich Street – Boston, MA [Exhibit 2] New Installation ASME A18.1-2014 Section 2.1.1.1 Petitioner: Kevin Hastings

The petitioner was in front of the Board on May 5, 2020 seeking a variance from ASME A18.1-2014 Section 2.1.1., to allow a 36" high guard at the upper landing. The petitioner provided the Board with additional information and the Board has requested that the petitioner come back in front of the Board and present all documentation including what was submitted to the Architectural Access Board.

• 10 Park Plaza – Boston, MA [Exhibit 3] State ID: 1-E-5875 and 1-E-5876 524 CMR Section 1.14 Petitioner: Don Partington

The petitioner was in front of the Board on June 2, 2020 seeking a product variance to install ClearWin Escalator Handrail UV Sterilizer systems on the two escalators at the above location. At the hearing conducted on June, 2, 2020, the Board tentatively approved the installation of the devices subject to further Board review and the understanding that if a variance is ultimately not granted and/or have been determined by the Board to be unsafe, they must be removed at the direction of the Board and/or DPL. OPSI Elevator Supervisor, Martin Guiod described his findings after a recent site visit. Mr. Guiod stated that he had safety concerns regarding the pinch point and the accessibility of the system for a child, which could cause harm. Based on this decision and safety concerns for the public, a motion was placed by David Morgan to deny the petitioner's request and have the devices removed immediately. The motion was seconded by Cheryl Davis.
