Call to Order 12:31 pm:

1. Continued discussion regarding the operation of the in-car stop switch during Firefighters Emergency Operation [Exhibits 1 through 6]:

Mr. Towski updates the Board of his communications with authorities having jurisdiction on how they teach in-car stop switch and the AHJ's response is that they do not teach this subject matter and it is not apart of the curriculum. Mr. Morse mentioned the stop switch being in active mode as long as the Phase I key switch is in the on position. The Board expressed concern of the stop switch effecting the operation of the doors when on

Mr. Towski asked if OPSI knows how many registered equipment in the Commonwealth have push versus pull and Mr. Morse responded, no. Mr. Morse also stated that in A17.1, emergency stop switch is different than an in-car stop switch and the difference is defined in code. Mr. Griefenhagen commented on the matter and requested for clarification of FS90 stop switch SOP. Inspector Janis commented that approximately 20% of stop switches are manual, not keyed, in Western Mass. Mr. Morse expressed that he would like to continue this discussion when all Board members are present and available to participate. A motion was made by Christopher Towski to place the discussion on hold until there is a full board present. The motion was seconded by Thomas McDermott.

2. Discussion on Open Meeting comments [Exhibit 7]:

Next, the Board briefly discussed an issue presented to the Board at the Public Hearing. The issue was brought to the attention of the Board by Mr. Griefenhagen and it is in regards to the enforcement of ASME A17.1-2013/CSA B44-13 Section 2.7.5.1. Mr. Griefenhagen stated he has received numerous calls from both, elevator mechanics and inspectors within OPSI's jurisdiction regarding an Elevator Contractor no longer installing what the elevator industry calls a "Car Blocking Device" or "Lock-n-Block". This is a safety device that has been installed by all manufacturers since it became a code required item in the adopted ASME A17.1S-2005 supplemental edition. This safety device is used to provide a safe walking and working surface for elevator mechanics and inspectors when they are performing maintenance and inspection tasks on equipment that is now located in the overhead of the elevator hoistway (other than traditional locations) on Machine Room Less elevators (MRL's). Mr. Gaudet suggested that Mr. McDermott add this matter to the agenda for the next all inspector's meeting. Mr. McDermott confirmed that the submitted material will be shared with the Supervisors to be passed along to the inspectors. A motion was made by Christopher Towski to place the discussion on hold until there is a full board present. The motion was seconded by David Morgan.

3. Approval of meeting minutes from July 26, 2022 [Exhibit 8]

4. Matters not reasonably anticipated 48 hours in advance of meeting:

Mr. Towski stated that Dragon Rescue Management reached out to him with educational materials and training procedures for the Fire Department. Mr. Morgan expressed concern stating that not all firefighters will be trained to act as a licensed Massachusetts elevator mechanic. Mr. Kelley advised the Board not to review training material on emergency extrication.
