Code: 524 CMR 2012 34.09 (1) - Vertical Wheelchair Lifts - Controls and Electrical Equipment

Petitioner: London Flats Condominium Trust c.o. Josh Andreasen

The petitioner was issued a violation, from a 2021 installation and 2022 annual inspection, of § 34.09(1) of the 2012 Elevator Code, 524 Code Mass. Regs. § 34.00, not the current elevator code and by its terms applicable only to installations prior to June 7, 1991. Petitioner seeks variance to dismiss or avoid the consequences of the issued violation.

The petitioner testified that there is no phone in the lift. Anthony Buonopane stated the permit set showed a keypad and not key switches. David Gaudet notified the board that in 2010 the Board of Elevator Regulations was required to remove key switches by the federal government. The board discussed that the current applicable 524 CMR code does not regulate key switches on wheelchairs and the CMR 521 2006 key switch language.

The board and counsel discussed how the situation might be handled by the department when an inspector cites the wrong code on an inspection report, namely that if someone disagrees with the results of an inspection report, it should be an appeal of the inspection report and not a variance request.

Eric Morse moved to deny the variance with the justification that the code cited is not applicable and therefore no variance can be allowed. Motion was seconded by Neil Mullane. Vote: 5-1-0

Museum of Science Drive Boston

New Elevator Installation

Code: 524 CMR 35.00 (ASME A17.1-2013) Section 3.4.1.1 - which requires a 24" minimum

clearance between the elevator car and pit.

Petitioner: Kevin Hastings

The petitioner is seeking a variance from 524 CMR 35.00 (ASME A17.1-2013) Section 3.4.1.1 - which requires a 24" minimum clearance between the elevator car and pit, as they are designing and building a new theater/convening space in the existing Blue Wing of the museum. In order

to provide access to the distributed accessible seating and control booth, they are proposing to install an 8" shallow pit elevator.

Nikol Patel testified that the 8-foot pit depth would be limited by the existing beam pockets and the 8-foot clear width would be from steel to steel and 2-inch fireproofing around would still need to be added. Additional limitations were that the Mezzanine space must be within the column supports and limited to the existing pockets and that the hoistway cannot be reduced due to the current ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements. Marina Archangeli verified that the wheelchair access would be for the seating area and the control room.

Mr. Towski requested that the petitioner clarify the address listed on the variance and the petitioner confirmed that the correct Cambridge address is 1 Science Park, Cambridge.

Chris Towski moved to grant the petitioner's request for a variance from 524 CMR 35.00 (ASME A17.1-2013) Section 3.4.1.1, with the justification that hardship was proven, and with additional safety conditions—automatic deployment of mat and appropriate signage and warnings. Petitioner: Gary West

The petitioner returning to the board, having appeared previously at the December 5, 2023, meeting, and providing additional documentation including plans and pictures of the current machine room. Seeking variance from 524 CMR Chapter 35.00 – ASME A17.1-2013 §§ 2.15.9.2(b), 3.4.1.1, 3.4.1.6, 3.4.4, and 3.4.7, requesting the use of a Gillespie Shallow Pit Safety System for an elevator located over occupied space.

The petitioner gave an overview of the new documentation submitted and addressed the specific items the board had originally questioned, including the loading dock area, which is used by the whole mall and cannot be modified, as 18-wheel tractor trailers must be able to utilize the loading dock space, pictures of the existing machine room that belongs to the mall and cannot be used for a pit, verifying that pulling the elevator disconnect disables all elevator functions including the battery lowering and the Gillespie safety system, and providing the outline of Inspection procedures, on how to test with and without building power, that will remain in the elevator with the controller.

Bryan Dunkelberger shared his screen to review the new documentation submitted [Exhibit 3] and highlight the specific areas that the board had previously requested. Members had specific questions about what the mall/landlord would allow and what the particular hardships were to justify the requested variances.

Chris Towski moved to table the matter for 90 days to allow the tenant to discuss additional options with the mall, to work with the elevator company manufacturer to review the specific code that cannot be met and to provide any detailed documentation showing hardship from relevant parties involved, including the landlord of the space.
