The petitioner is seeking a variance from A17.1 2.23.2(b) as Cleary Elevator Company states that due to the fact that there is not enough clearance to install new counterweight rail guides or counterweights. Any other material could prove to be a safety hazard.

Robert Cleary summarized the request for variance by explaining that this is a 100-year-old elevator that is a basement drum machine elevator with the main rails being steel and the counterweight rails being wooden rails. There is very limited space for the counterweight system and platform. While reviewing the submitted pictures, he provided that there is only ¾ of an inch from the wall to the platform and a 1-inch clearance to the car. Mr. Cleary also indicated that there had been a modernization of the elevator completed in 2023, which included removing old equipment, replacing the controller, governor, wiring, safeties, new door equipment, fixtures, CAB, door operator, and roller guides.

The board asked questions about the existing elevator counterweight rail systems and asked about the feasibility of adding tube steel railings, changing the platform, adding metal pans over the existing wood railings, and/or changing out the wood rails for new wood rails. The board discussed the safety concerns that having wooden rails entails, which includes 100 years of saturated oil in the existing wood railings and the fire hazards associated with that, the rating of the wood to be used for new rails, if replaced and meeting the 524CMR code.

Robert Cleary submitted additional evidence at the hearing: a video sent to Ms. Richardson by email and shared with the board via Teams platform.

After discussion, Anthony Buonopane moved to grant the requested variance from § 2.23.2(b) of ASME A17.1-2013 with the following conditions: the counterweight frame and rail brackets must be cleaned of grease; a non-flammable lubricant must be applied to the wood and steel rails; and a flame retardant must be applied to the backside of the wooden counterweight rails. Tim Morgan seconded the motion. Vote: 6-0-0
