for patient admissions. The petitioner explained that a Life Safety Survey was conducted

on the facility on December 15, 2021, and New England Pediatric Care was not found in

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substantial compliance with the requirements for participation in Medicare/Medicaid, 42 CFR, 483.90(a-d), by failing to provide sprinkler protection for the elevator and hydraulic elevator machine room. The petitioner stated if the variance is granted, work will begin with upgrading the sprinkler system and bringing the fire protection up to meet the Federal Code requirements. A motion was made by David Morgan to grant the petitioner's request with the justification being hardship resulting from the withholding of federal funding due to an inspection CMS for non-compliance with NFPA 13 – 1999 Edition of the Standard for the installation of Sprinkler Systems. Specifically, that sprinklers are not installed in the elevator machine room, hoistway and pits. Prior established guidelines will be issued with the variance decision. The motion was seconded by Christopher Towski.

### 3. 9 Glen Road, Wellesley [Exhibit 4]

State ID: 317-P-325 A17.1 §2.27.3.3.1(d)

**Petitioner: George Cronin** 

The petitioner was in front of the Board seeking a variance from A17.1 §2.27.3.3.1(d). The petitioner stated that according to Inspector George Ramian, the cited code section is requiring the installation of a "peekaboo circuit". Mr. Ramian, after being sworn, explained the violation. The petitioner stated that it would cost an estimated \$8,000 to upgrade the controller from Associated Elevator and this would cause a financial hardship for the owner. A motion was made by David Gaudet to deny the variance request from the applicable code A17.1-1996 §211.3(a)(3), which states "A car stopped at a landing shall have the in-car emergency stop switch or in-car stop switch rendered inoperative as soon as the car moves away from the landing. A moving car shall have the in-car emergency stop switch rendered inoperative without delay".

Justification being safety and code compliance. The motion was seconded by Christopher Towski.

# 4. GEN3 Elevator [Exhibit 5]

**Product Variance** 

A17.1-2013 2.22 and A17.1-2013 2.18.4.2.5(a)

**Petitioner: Russ Larson** 

The petitioner was in front of the Board seeking a product variance for the GEN3 Elevator, which will supersede the GEN2 Elevator. The petitioner stated that the GEN3 controller, suspension means, and code related documentation are identical to the GEN2. GEN3 is a rebranding of the GEN2 product. Changes or upgrades include connectivity to the internet, including diagnostics for mechanics and owners. E-Call is a Bluetooth technology to place call demands when the car is in automatic operations, only. Cab purifiers are an option with the GEN3. GEN2 variance has a slowdown switch approved variance and the GEN3 will have a software slowdown control. Also, the GEN3 will have elastomeric buffers, which are included in the 2016 code. The GEN3 contains several forward-thinking components that are not explicitly allowed in A17.1-2013. Mr. Morgan noted that no variance is cited in the application. The petitioner replied the variance being sought is to allow elastomeric buffers A17.1-2013 §2.22 and to allow the use of a hardware based electronic speed reducing switch A17.1-2013 §2.18.4.2.5(a). Mr. Larson explained that the internet connectivity is a "read only system" and understood that remote manipulation is not allowed. A motion was made by Neil Mullane to grant the variance for the GEN3 Elevator from the applicable code noted above, with a Board site visit in the first installation. The motion was seconded by David Gaudet.
