**Unit Replacement** 

Petitioner seeks relief from 524 CMR, incorporating ASME A18.1- 2. 7.1, which requires: "Travel of lifts conforming to paras. 2.1.1 and 2.1.3 shall not exceed 4250 mm (168 in.) or 14 feet".

Bob Hicks explained that the vertical lift connects three floors, and they are limited in space because of the building's historic nature. The existing lift is not working, and the museum needs full accessibility and replacement of the same size. The variance is relative to the height (14 feet). The board and the petitioner discuss if this elevator is a LULA or a passenger elevator. Bob Hicks shares copies of the original variance [Exhibit 1A] referred to the elevator car size section 35.4 as 36' x 50' deep. Discussion related to, if elevator is a LULA, no variance needed and, to the extent there is cab size issue, that would be reviewed by AAB in the first instance.

David Morgan moved to table the matter for 60 days to 7/17/23 at the request of the petitioner. If no further action is taken by the petitioner, then the petition will be considered abandoned. The motion was seconded by David Gaudet. Vote 7-0-0. Deadline July 17, 2023

Chris Lyons, the project manager, shared the schematic drawings of the machine room, [Exhibit 3], and explained where the new controller will be located, against the far back wall. Eric Walsh stated that an auxiliary disconnect can be added and photos of the machine room were shared, [Exhibit 3A].

David Morgan moved to grant the variance to 524 CMR Section 35.00, § 2.7.4.1 to pursuant to the schematic submitted to the Board indicating parts of the machine room with heights of less than 7' with the following conditions: the ceiling subject to the variance will be painted yellow, there will be additional signage placed on the wall and on the machine room door stating that there is low overhead. The driver over platform is a traveling bridge with a 2 13/16-inch gap but they can and have gotten that lower. There is an 8-foot curb from the drive over platform to the entry-level platform. The petitioner seeks a variance for a new installation of a semi-automated parking unit, 524 CMR 26.07 protection at other levels, 524 CMR 26.11 car enclosure and car gates. This matter was placed on hold during the March 21, 2023, meeting with additional information.

Ryan Myers shared 3-D pictures which were submitted to the Board [Exhibit 5]. Ryan Myers referenced that drawing 5 x 4 x 9 has access to the corridor identical to 267 Old Colony Avenue, Boston.

The board asked questions regarding the hydraulic power unit, the width of platforms being at code requirement, if training will be provided, the photo-eye sensor being from front to rear, the weight difference between electric cars and regular cars, and what the weight capacity will be per platform. Ryan Meyers answered all questions presented by the board.

Petitioner: Jill Ledin, BBE Corp-Buckley Elevator

The petitioner referenced 524 CMR 11.02. The elevator was decommissioned in 2019. The tenant is moving back into the building and would like to get the elevator back in service. The owner Ronald Oliveira explained that the building was formerly an adult day care facility that was vacant for two years and the elevator was shut down. He is looking to rent the property to Taunton Community Care Services. The photos of the project were submitted during the meeting and shared with the Board, [Exhibit 4A].

Buckley elevator mechanic Michael Buckley explained the intention is to place the elevator back in service per code. However, they are unsure if it would be the 1996 code, to which Eric Morse stated it would be required to bring it up to the current code.

David Gaudet made a motion to table the item for 60 days, until July 15, 2023, to allow the petitioner to provide more information. Specifically, to provide time to review current formal code and propose any alternative means to meet safety requirements. If no further action is

taken by the petitioner, then the petition will be considered abandoned. Neil Mullane seconded the motion. Anthony Buonopane spoke about cross plank shaft designs in relation to elevators and there are no ratings inside A17 code which is a concern, since it's a wooden structure. There are questions on shaft construction and sprinkler systems in the hoistways of specific floors serviced, there appears to be some confusion as some require sprinklers and in elevator code it's not allowed. Eric Morse deferred to Brian Ronan about the shaft construction. Mr. Ronan explained the restriction and that fire rating is considered. • Chris Towski referred to conducting a site visit to visit Occupant Evacuation Elevator in Cambridge and is looking for suggested dates by the board.
