Petitioner: Galina Slezinger

The petitioner is back before the board requesting an extension of time to produce the additional documentation as they would like the opportunity to appeal the decision of the AAB. The petitioner was before the board on June 3, 2025, and March 4, 2025, seeking a variance from ASME A18.1 2014 section 3.1.2.2 for overhead clearance to install new lift to replace the existing lift. The board voted to extend the original 60 day hold by an additional 60 days, which will be a deadline of August 4, 2025, to provide additional documentation.

Doug Anderson explained that Galina Slezinger had applied to the AAB (Architecture Access Board) on July 14, 2025, for the use of a replacement incline wheelchair lift, but was denied. Ms. Slezinger applied for an adjudicatory hearing which is scheduled for November 17, 2025. Doug Anderson stated that they are requesting an extension of time to produce the additional documentation requested by the board as they would like the opportunity to be heard by the AAB and then come back before the Board of Elevator Regulations.

After a discussion by the board, Tim Morgan moved to place the petition on hold until the first available board meeting in December 2025, to allow the petitioner to return to the AAB on November 17, 2025. Chris Towski seconded the motion. Vote 6-0-0

Petitioner: Justin DiConzo

Mr. Mullane took no part in the discussion of, or the deliberation upon, this matter. The petitioner is back before the board after the board voted on June 3, 2025, to place the item on a 60-day hold, which provided a deadline of August 4, 2025, to provide additional documentation. A letter from the Deputy Chief of Technical Engineering & Design of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation was provided on August 8, 2025.

The petitioner is seeking relief from A17.1-2013, code section 2.11.10.1.1 metal fascia requirement seeking to substitute with a laminated safety glass that is stamped "laminated safety glass AS-2". It has the exact same characteristics as the laminated safety glass requiring the Z97.1.

Jason O'Dowd presented the board with a summary of the request by stating that the MBTA is not looking to change the existing glass variance for new installs but that they would like to have a blanket variance put in place to replace a piece of glass when there is vandalism to existing equipment. They would like the ability to use a temporary piece of glass that does not have the Z rating and will not have the stamp but is comparable for emergent purposes due to vandalism. Mr. O'Dowd stated that with the four hundred units they currently have, there is some form of vandalism to the glass usually weekly but at a minimum bi-weekly. The standard turnaround time for the vendor to cut a Z97.1 rated stamped piece of glass is eight to ten weeks.

Mr. O'Dowd continued to explain that when a unit is vandalized and there is broken glass involved, the MBTA will not run the unit for safety purposes. This blanket variance would allow the MBTA to get the glass fixed at a faster rate as the glass vendor, Melrose Glass, is local and would be able to cut the temporary piece of glass within a few days.

After a detailed discussion by the board, Chris Towski moved to place the petition on hold for no more than 60 days for the petitioner to present an architect's or engineer's review of the proposed changes to the existing approved specifications and to propose how the glass will be identified in the field. Tim Morgan seconded the motion. Vote 5-0-0 Deadline October 25, 2025.

Petitioner: Cheri Allen

The petitioner is in front of the board after a previously scheduled appearance was not heard during the July 29, 2025, board meeting. The petitioner is seeking a variance from 524 CMR 17.07(10) requesting that a peephole be installed instead of the large glass panels required by code to retain privacy and the doors' original detail.

Deborah Thomas had technical difficulties with both video and audio throughout the meeting.

Dennis Drisoll gave a summary that included that the building had an elevator inspection on January 19, 2025, and was cited as a swing door must have a vision panel on each level. There are currently two common area doors, one on the basement level that has a vision panel and one on the main lobby level that does not have a vision panel. Floors three through six are private residences that do not have a vision panel. The request for

the variance is to be allowed to forego a vision panel on each level that does not currently have one or at least to be able to minimize the vision panel to a peep hole to limit exposure.

The basement level door is a steel door that is not original to the building but a newer door. The current doors to the residences are wooden ornate doors, some of which are more than one hundred years old. The lobby door is a large, curved door that is original to the building's historic design.

After a detailed discussion by the board, David Gaudet moved to place the application on hold for further action by the board. After the petitioner submits photographs of the CAB, COP, Halls and Hall Station S, the board will schedule a Quasi-Judicial session to further discuss the matter. Chris Towski seconded the motion. Petitioner: Michelle Harpin

The petitioner is seeking a variance from 524 CMR 35.00. Section 8.1.4 to remove the Medial Emergency board from the Elevator system as the board is non-repairable and considered obsolete.

James Callahan gave a summary of the variance request for code cited 2.27.12 amended on 8.1.4 requiring an elevator to have medical emergency operations. They feel this code is covered by the exceptions, as the building involved is a 2-stop hydra elevator that is too small to fit a stretcher in it. The building has rollable access on both floors to the street and that is how all medical emergency transportation is conducted. Emergency Medical Technicians and the Fire Department have not used the elevator for this purpose. The first acceptance test inspection was done in August of 1995. The unit was placarded on December 6, 2024, after the work from a 90-day reinspection was not completed, as the board that controls medical emergencies is obsolete and cannot be repaired or replaced. Mr. Callahan included that when the application was submitted, he erroneously cited Section 8.1.4, but they are requesting a variance for Section 2.27.12.

After discussion by the board, David Gaudet moved to deny the variance request as no variance is needed on the basis that the underlying condition is not in violation of 524

CMR 17.40 (6)(b). Petitioner to remove Medical Emergency fixtures from the elevator and apply for a placard removal. The motion was seconded by Chris Towski. Vote 6-0-0.

Petitioner: Spencer Preservation Group

The petitioner is seeking a variance from ASME A17.1-2013 - 2.7.1.2.1 b regarding the height of the machine room.

Doug Manley gave a summary that included that this is an existing building that was built in 1886 and is on the National Register. They have been working on a project to bring handicap accessibility to the building by way of a new elevator and accessible restrooms. The elevator is an Otis Gen 3 that was installed by Delta Beckwith Elevator Company. It is a 3500 lb. four stop elevator. While reviewing the punch list, the installer indicted that the newly created machine room was noncompliant with the minimum ceiling height. A portion of the room has a soffit that brings the room height to 6' 2", with the rest of the room being at 7'1".

After discussion by the board, David Gaudet moved to place the petition on hold for no more than 90 days, until November 24, 2025, for the petitioner to submit additional information and drawings. Signage on the machine room door with the words "DANGER LOW CLEARANCE AND STEP DOWN IN MACHINE ROOM". Sign prominently posted on the soffit and beam with the words "DANGER LOW CLEARANCE" and on the floor height transition "DANGER STEP DOWN". The marking shall consist of alternating 100 mm (4 in.) diagonal red and white stripes on beam and soffit faces and on the floor where floor steps down. Install an obstruction to limit access to the low beam area adjacent to the door and controller. The petitioner will also add all additional code variances required. If no further action is taken by the petitioner, then the petition will be considered abandoned. The motion was seconded by Chris Towski. Vote 6-0-0 Deadline November 24, 2025.
