The petitioner is seeking a variance from A17.1 2013 2.7.5.3.3 Section 2.7 for a safety railing on an elevated work platform more than 12" as a fall hazard, as the railing will interfere with the T cable on units 1-P-22490, 1-P-22491 and 1-P-22492.

Brian Jenkel indicated that the is landing 15'-10" from grade below and the service platform is 6'-1" below the sill, the toe guard is in front, and the T cable is in the corner, platform to platform is 3 feet, and it is steel.

Based on the pictures provided the board suggested multiple options for the petitioner to mitigate fall hazard, including lowering the platform, while still working on the bottom of the car; in-filling holes so no one can fall; and changing the pit depth

After a discussion by the board, a motion was made by Eric Morse to deny the variance with the justification that the platform presents a fall safety hazard, the platform can be reconfigured or lowered and extended to mitigate the fall hazard, and no hardship has been shown. found not in compliance with the requirements for participation in Medicare/Medicaid, 42 CFR, 483.90(a-d), by failing to provide sprinkler protection for the elevator and hydraulic elevator machine room. Without the requested variance the funding from Medicare/Medicaid will be cutoff as of November 7, 2024.

Chris Towski moved to grant the petitioner's request for a variance from 524 CMR 35:00 §2.8.3.3 to allow the installation of sprinkler coverage in the elevator shaft and machine room with the justification being hardship resulting from the withholding of federal funding due to waiver issued by CMS. Petitioner: Christine Parnell

The petitioner is back in front of the board after appearing on July 16, 2024, for VAR24-0029 and VAR24-0030, substantially similar petitions which were withdrawn at the request of the petitioner after the board requested the signed modernization proposal and a timeline of the work to be done including the start and stop dates, with the duration of time for each unit. The petitioner is now, again seeking a variance from A17.1 – 2.27.3.3.31d for the postponement of the FS90 work, because the work will be addressed during the modernization, to begin early 2025 (Feb).

Christine Parnell gave a summary of the request for an extension of the FS90 work requirement so that the updates can be made during the modernization project, which is currently estimated to start in December 2024 or January 2025, depending on when the materials are ordered and delivered. Christine Parnell also requested that the elevators be allowed to continue to run, as each unit is being modernized one at a time, as this is a hospital, and the elevators are needed for life safety.

Michael Murdzia reiterated that they are planning on the modernization project taking three months per unit and will be done one at a time so that the other elevators can be used during the modernization project. Ken Carpenter further explained that they had attempted to fix the FS90 issue on 4 separate attempts but were unable to achieve the fix.

After a discussion by the board, Neil Mullane moved to grant the variance request to extend the deadline for FS90 repair compliance until September 1, 2025, which will allow for all three (3) elevators to be either modernized and fully code compliant or be placed out of service. Mr. Mullane stated that the justification that Otis has tried to resolve the issues through attempted repairs, but having any elevator out of service is a significant hardship for the hospital. The motion was seconded by David Gaudet. Vote 6-0-0 Deadline September 1, 2025.
