Grade: 6	Unit:				
State Standard(s):	Use map and globe skills learned in prekindergarten to grade five to interpret different kinds of projections, as well as topographic, landform, political, population, and climate maps. Provide examples of currencies from several countries and explain why international trade requires a system for exchanging currency between nations.				
Objective:	Students will gain research and writing skills by reporting on geographic locations and historic events based on a selected route through the European continent.

Lesson Outline: Students are asked to 1) select a bicycle route on the European continent and 2) determine which major geographic and civic landmarks it runs through.

Europe is home to some of the best bicycle infrastructure in the world. Many major cities and small towns alike prioritize bike lanes and bike parking. In addition, international bicycle routes span several countries. For this project, imagine you are planning a bicycle trip across Europe.

Choose one of the routes from the map below and research the answers to the questions on the next page.

2. What geographical elements should you be prepared for (name any rivers, mountains, deserts etc. you may encounter)?

3. Draw your route on the map below, what is the distance (in kilometers) of your chosen route? How long will this trip take you?

Vocabulary Term Answer Key

1. European Union:

An association of European nations formed in 1993 for the purpose of achieving political and economic integration. Incorporating the European Community, the European Union's member states are Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom. In 2016 the United Kingdom voted by referendum to withdraw from membership in the European Union. Abbreviation: EU

2. Schengen Area:

Today, the Schengen Area encompasses most EU States, except for Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Ireland, Romania and the United Kingdom. However, Bulgaria and Romania are currently in the process of joining the Schengen Area. Of non-EU States, Iceland, Norway, Switzerland and Liechtenstein have joined the Schengen Area.
