### THE "EYE" - ALTERNATIVE 1A



- Eliminate weaving
- Increase green space along River

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Maintain signalization



### THE "EYE" - ALTERNATIVE 1B



- Eliminate weaving
- Increase green space along River

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Convert to Roundabouts



### THE "EYE" - ALTERNATIVE 1C



- Eliminate weaving
- Increase green space along River/ rec use

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Access to rec use at intersection



### THE "EYE" - ALTERNATIVE 1D



- Eliminate weaving
- Increase green space along River/ rec use

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Access to rec use removed from intersection – driveway location TBD



### THE "EYE" - ALTERNATIVE 1E



- Eliminate weaving
- Relocate rec use along River
- Old pool parcel dissected

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Access to rec use at intersections
- Complicates turn movements







- Reduce to one lane per direction
- Maintain existing median

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- May allow for sidewalk only







- Reduce to one lane per direction
- Undivided lanes on EB pavement

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Use WB pavement for shared use path



### PARKWAY – ALTERNATIVE 2C



- Reduce to one lane per direction
- Divided lanes with reduced median

- Expand ped/bike facilities
- Use WB pavement for shared use path



#### SECONDARY INTERSECTIONS



- Reduce to one lane per direction
- Eliminate excess pavement

- Realign through movements
- Expand ped/bike facilities
