At this public meeting, DCR will present pre-25% designs for the North Beacon Street and Birmingham Parkway corridor, between the Soldiers Field Road and Market Street, excluding the rotary, with the objective of creating new access to the reservation, improving traffic safety, and reclaiming park land.
