

## **RMP Requirements**

Management plans are prepared for "all reservations, parks, and forests under the management of the department"

M.G.L. Chapter 21; Section 2F









## RMPs Shall ....

"include guidelines for the operation and land stewardship of... reservations, parks and forests"

"provide for the protection and stewardship of natural and cultural resources"

"ensure consistency between recreation, resource protection and sustainable forest management"

M.G.L. Chapter 21; Section 2F



## **Resource Management Plans:**

- Consider the past, present, and future of a property
- Help guide management
- Help set priorities for capital and operating budgets, and resource allocation
- Enhance communication and cooperation with visitors, partners, and surrounding communities




## **Management Complex**






- DCR manages over 400 properties (more than 450,000 acres)
- Properties are grouped into 32 complexes, each managed by a Field Operations Team
- An RMP covers <u>all</u> properties in a complex





## **Recommendations Must**





#### "Ensure consistency between recreation, resource protection and sustainable forest management"

#### Address one or more of the following:

- Natural resource stewardship and restoration activities consistent with park identity and intended to improve ecological function and connectivity.
- Cultural resource management activities consistent with park identity and intended to prevent the loss of integrity of significant cultural resources.
- Improvements consistent with park identity that are needed to support intended park activities.
- Actions required for regulatory compliance or compliance with legal agreements.
- Activities that prevent or ameliorate threats to the health and safety of park visitors and employees.
