CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Ms. Kim at 1:30 p.m.

Item #1 MOTION- VOTE

Acceptance and Approval of September 11, 2019 Minutes

The motion was made by Ms. Jonas-Silver and seconded by Commissioner Suuberg and voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on September 11, 2019.

Item #2 **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

Ms. Perez provided an update on the Executive Committee's discussions on the proposed school bottle filling station program. The Trust's outside counsel reviewing the proposed program has said that the Trust has the authority to proceed with the program. Based on this analysis, Commissioner Suuberg would need to certify that the program is an eligible drinking water project as its activities significantly further the public health provisions of the Safe Drinking Water Act. Commissioner Suuberg agreed and stated that he was reviewing the suggested certification submitted by the Trust.

Commissioner Suuberg noted that there was language in the Governor's Fiscal Year 2019 Supplemental Budget that allows for grants to be issued for addressing lead in school drinking water and that provision would be important for the program. Additionally, Commissioner Suuberg said that MassDEP would also be advocating for the funding designated to address Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) mitigation and increased lending capacity for the Trust.

Ms. Jonas-Silver said that if the Legislature adopts the 2020 Senate budget amendment language that limited program funding to \$5 million, then it should not be a problem to request additional funding authorization if the program is successful. Ms. Perez mentioned how the EPA supports the bottle filling station program and Massachusetts' program could set an example for other states to follow.

Ms. Perez concluded by announcing that the Trust's Series 22 bond deal is still on schedule. Pricing for this bond deal is to take place on October 16th and 17th. Retail pricing will be on the 16th and institutional pricing will be on the 17th. People interested in watching the pricing can come to the Trust's office at 1 Center Plaza.

Item #3 **MOTION- VOTE**

The motion was made by Ms. Jonas-Silver and seconded by Commissioner Suuberg.

Ms. Jonas-Silver mentioned how she also serves on the board for the Clean Energy Center (CEC). The CEC is reviewing technology from a private company that uses machine learning to detect which pipes will break. She said that she would forward information to the Board.

Commissioner Suuberg said that MassDEP could let organizations like the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority and Massachusetts Water Works Association that may be interested, know about this idea.
