**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Mr. MacDonald at 1:31 p.m.

## Item #3 **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

## School Water Improvement Grant (SWIG) Program

Ms. Perez noted that the SWIG program was officially announced on January 13<sup>th</sup> in conjunction with MassDEP's school lead testing program. Commissioner Suuberg added that MassDEP has received several calls about testing school drinking water and to ask general questions about the SWIG program.

Ms. Jonas-Silver asked if MassDEP and the Trust are tracking contacts and noted that collecting feedback on how people find out about these programs could be valuable for future outreach. Mr. MacDonald noted that the Massachusetts School Building Authority could be used as a resource for outreach. Ms. Perez added that the Trust was working with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education on outreach and exploring the possibility of having other relevant agencies conduct outreach.

## Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) Mitigation Projects

Ms. Perez updated the Board on the progress of calculating project capacity for mitigating PFAS. Two-line items from the FY 2019 Supplemental Budget will increase project capacity by nearly \$20 million for PFAS mitigation projects. Ms. Perez noted that the Executive Committee would be meeting on Friday to discuss this in greater detail. She noted that the Executive Committee agreed that funding allocated to any projects that later drop from the 2020 Drinking Water Intended Use Plan (DW IUP) may be reserved for emergency PFAS projects

Commissioner Suuberg stated that he expects there to be an increase in demand for PFAS mitigation projects once final PFAS rules are adopted. Currently, MassDEP has draft rules for maximum contaminant level and testing requirements. The public commenting periods for these rules should be complete by mid-February with final rules completed by the middle of the 2020 calendar year. Ms. Perez noted that there is already a \$30 million emergency funding request from the Town of Barnstable for a PFAS mitigation project. Ms. Pinaud said that PFAS mitigation projects will be given high priority and incorporated into future DW IUPs.
