**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Mr. MacDonald at 1:35 p.m.

### Item #1 MOTION- VOTE

### Acceptance and Approval of December 2, 2020 Minutes

The motion was made by Mr. MacDonald and seconded by Ms. Pinaud and voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on December 2, 2020.

### Item #2 REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Ms. Perez thanked Mr. Keenan and Mr. Kalivas for mailing out invoices to borrowers for the payments due on January 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Trust's Fiscal Year 2020 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) was filed in later December. The efforts of Ms. Peacock, the rest of the accounting staff, and Ms. Stanton's design work are greatly appreciated especially since this is the first time it was all done remotely.

Recommendations for the current School Water Improvement Grant (SWIG) program and its expansion, ESWIG, are being developed. Mr. Maple's work with this is greatly appreciated.

The 2021 Intended Use Plans (IUPs) have been drafted and are under review. MassDEP expects to be publishing the draft IUPs shortly.

The Trust's Series 23 bond deal is expected to close at the end of April. Much of the work will be completed before then and will start soon.

#### Item #3 **MOTION- VOTE**

The motion was made by Mr. MacDonald and seconded by Ms. Pinaud.

Ms. Perez said that a Request for Responses (RFR) for lead underwriter for the Series 23 issuance was posted on November 5, 2020. A total of 31 firms responded. Firms that submitted a response looking to be book-running senior manager that were not selected were automatically considered for co-senior manager and co-manager.

Responses were to demonstrate a firm's ability to meet the financial needs of the Trust, marketing distribution capabilities, and underwriting ability.

The syndicate is to have Morgan Stanley as Book-Running Senior Manager. Jeffries and RBC are to be co-senior managers. American Veterans Group, Bancroft, Citigroup Global Markets, and Siebert Williams Shank are to be co-managers.

Minority and veteran owned firms submitted responses and of those firms, the Trust selected Americans Veterans Group and Siebert Williams Shank to be in the syndicate.

The motion was voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the following:

#### Selection of Underwriter

- 1. That the recommendation of the Procurement Management Team, established pursuant to the Trust's Request for Reponses: Underwriting Services, dated November 5, 2020 (the "UW-RFR") for the negotiated sale of the Trust's Series 23 Green Bonds, previously distributed to the Board, is hereby approved.
- 2. That the Board hereby delegates to the Executive Director all necessary power and authority to negotiate and reach agreement with the lead underwriter, acting on behalf of the underwriting syndicate, and to execute and deliver to the lead underwriter a bond purchase agreement for the sale of the Series 23 Green Bonds.
- 3. That the Board further delegates to the Executive Director all necessary power and authority to execute and deliver such other agreements, certificates, notices, and other instruments as the Executive Director deems necessary to ensure the successful sale of the Series 23 Green Bonds.
