CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Treasurer Goldberg at 1:30 p.m.

Item #1 MOTION- VOTE

Acceptance and Approval of June 2, 2021 Minutes

The motion was made by Commissioner Suuberg and seconded by Treasurer Goldberg and voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on June 2, 2021.

Item #2 **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds

Commissioner Suuberg said that the governor filed legislation for a portion of the ARPA funds awarded to Massachusetts to go towards water infrastructure projects administered by the Trust. There is a timing element involved with using these funds since there are deadlines that will need to be met.

ARPA funds for water projects could be applied to the 2022 Intended Use Plan to increase capacity.

Ms. Perez stated that there are focus areas like PFAS remediation, sewer system expansion, lead surveys, and combined sewer overflows that ARPA funds could go towards. The Trust and MassDEP will keep focus areas in mind when preparing testimony for the Massachusetts State Legislature.

Matching grant programs could be developed where the Trust will match local use of ARPA funds with its own ARPA funds.

Commissioner Suuberg said that he can report on ARPA funds that will be devoted to housing, which could include sewer system expansion, at a future meeting.

Small and Disadvantaged Communities Survey

Mr. Keenan said that the Trust worked with Northbridge, a consulting group that works with the EPA on State Revolving Fund (SRF) matters, and sent a survey out to small and disadvantaged communities in Massachusetts.

So far, 289 responses have been received for a response rate over 30% which is higher than expected. Northbridge is preparing a draft report that they will submit in approximately one week.

The goal of the survey is to understand what these groups know about the Trust and what they see as issues to accessing financing. From the initial survey, the Trust expects to work with Northbridge to identify a focus group of communities to take a deeper dive into the issues identified in the survey.

An update is expected to be ready for the next Board meeting.

Item #3 **MOTION- VOTE**

Ms. Perez said that Drinking Water grant expenses have increased since last year because the needs survey is now scheduled for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022.

Some contracts from FY 2021 were delayed so they are now being budgeted for again in FY 2022.

Legal expenses were not to the same magnitude last year as previous years.

The motion was voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the following:

That the Board of Trustees approves the Trust's fiscal year 2022 budget request of the Department of Environmental Protection, distributed to the Board, for funds from the Clean Water and Drinking Water administrative grant funds and set-aside funds for the administration of the state revolving fund.
