CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Mr. MacDonald at 1:30 p.m.

Item #1 MOTION- VOTE

Acceptance and Approval of July 10, 2019 Minutes

Item #2 **MOTION- VOTE**

Item #3 **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

Ms. Perez announced that the solicitation for projects for the 2020 Intended Use Plan went out and online applications are being accepted for the first time this year.

The Series 22 bond deal is progressing with borrowers being notified and final information being requested. Pricing is schedule for the middle of October with closing on the 24th. Due diligence with attorneys is scheduled to begin the week of August 19th.

Asset Management Planning Grants are to be voted for the first time this Board meeting.

The Trust will begin the process of having all Board meeting materials distributed electronically. The Trust will look into using the same practices of other Commonwealth of Massachusetts entities such as the Massachusetts School Building Authority and the State Retirement Board.

Item #4 **MOTION- VOTE**

The motion was made by Commissioner Suuberg and seconded by Ms. Jonas-Silver.

It was discussed that MassDEP is reviewing the process for incorporating Federal requirements into their documents and wants to table the approval of the changes to the Financing Agreement until that process has been completed.

The motion was voted unanimously in favor of tabling.

Ms. Perez gave an overview of the proposed budget. MassDEP payroll related expenses have risen since vacant positions are expected to be filled. MassDEP programmatic expenses will be increasing with the continued funding of the Availability Analysis and the expected funding of the Martha's Vineyard 208 Plan, which final costs are not yet known.

There is a place holder for website design since the Trust expects to issue a request for proposal (RFP) to create a new website.

Due to the above costs, the 2020 Fiscal Year Budget has a deficit. However, these additional costs will be covered by the administrative fund.

The motion was voted unanimously in favor of acceptance and approval of the following:

That the Board of Trustees approves the Trust's fiscal year 2020 budget request of the Department of Environmental Protection, distributed to the Board, for funds from the Clean Water and Drinking Water administrative grant funds and set-aside funds for the administration of the state revolving fund.

OTHER BUSINESS: Commissioner Suuberg mentioned how MassDEP has been working on new Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) in drinking water standards. Communities have been doing voluntary testing. MassDEP is looking to bring a list of communities doing this voluntary testing along with its drinking water standards and other relevant information to a future Board meeting.

In addition, MassDEP has received approximately \$900,000 in EPA grant funding to continue testing for lead in school water. MassDEP has been in contact with schools across Massachusetts to remind them that water samples need to be taken to test for lead. Informational flyers are being distributed to schools to help create awareness about lead in drinking water.
