#### The Board discussed the following:

1. Beta Max

**Product Variance** 

Petitioner: James Bourdreau

The petitioner came before the Board seeking a product variance. The proposed hoisting system delivers materials to the job level after scaffold is in place. It is used for scaffolding erection and dismantlement. The maximum lifting capacity is 450 lbs and is equipped with an overweight limit switch. The petitioner stated that the proposed hoisting system expedites production and personnel, but the main thing is that it increases safety for workers on scaffolding. A letter dated August 5, 2016 from Shanon Beekman, Beta Max Director of Electrical Design, gave a written response to the Maxial Track Hoist System and how it relates to the ANSI A10.5 and ANSI B30.7. The petitioner stated that after further analyzing A10.5 and B30.7, the Maxial System does not comply with numerous sections. A motion was put forth by Stephen Sampson to deny the variance with the justification that the Board believes that this product is not under the Board's jurisdiction. The motion was seconded by Cheryl Davis.

## 2. 125 Summer Street

524 CMR § 35 2.7.2.2 and A17.1 2004 2.7.6

The petitioner came before the Board seeking a variance from 524 CMR § 35 2.7.2.2 and A17.1 2004 2.7.6, in regards to the maintenance clearance around the machine and having the machine in the hoistway. The petitioner is proposing to remove the existing hydraulic elevators and install a new MRL manufactured by Delaware Elevator. The petitioner stated they will be using a Torin TPM4-3520-HV-10MM machine. A motion was put forth by David Gaudet to grant the variance as requested and justification being that similar machines are being installed in the state under the accepted program for MRL's. The motion was seconded by John O'Donoghue.
