1. The Board of Elevator Regulations ("Board") reviewed the Meeting Minutes from October 27, 2015. A motion to accept these minutes was made by Cheri Davis, seconded by David Gaudet. 5-0 Vote. McGonagle Abstained.

The Board discussed the following:

2. Executive Order 562

The Board is currently reviewing the elevator code, 524 CMR, pursuant to Executive Order 562. The Board invited the public to attend this listening session as a way for them to voice their concerns and provide input on suggested changes to 524 CMR. The following is a list of the public's comments:

(1) Tom Archie, PFLOW Industries, discussed recommended changes to 524 CMR 32.00 Vertical Reciprocating Conveyors ("VRC"). He provided the Board with a hardcopy of his recommendations to be reviewed at future code review sessions.

(2) Don Bruck, Baron Industries, discussed changes to 524 CMR 32.00 (VRC). He provided the Board with a hardcopy of his recommendations to be reviewed at future code review sessions.

Matt Carlin Commissioner (3) John Dalton advocated for the adoption of ASME A17.1-2013 and recommended that 524 CMR 10.1 & 10.2 be thoroughly reviewed for permitting purposes.

(4) Rachel Silver was advocating for the approval of Pneumatic Elevators in the Commonwealth.

(5) Eric Morse, VDA, recommended keeping the modifications to a minimum and ensures that any changes are clear and concise. Also, he recommended that issues involving building code such as ventilation, smoke control, and pressurization requirements should be pushed back into the Building Code. He asked the Board to review Section 8, specifically the "Alteration Section", of the current regulation.

(6) Peter Wallack, Lerch Bates, asked the Board to review automobile parking devices and VRC.

(7) Herb Siegel advocated for the approval of Pneumatic Elevators in Massachusetts.

(8) Elaine Siegel advocated for the approval of Pneumatic Elevator in Massachusetts.

(9) Bruce Horne, Otis Elevator, discussed updating the code to relieve some aspects of the variance

appeal process. He also discussed the adoption of the Performance Based Code.

(10) Heather Brown, Schindler, recommended that the Board review 30-Day vs. 90-Day Temporary Certificates.

(12) Maryann Conway advocated for the approval of Pneumatic Elevator in Massachusetts.

The Board thanked the public for voicing their concerns and recommendations and agreed to take their comments under consideration.

3. 1287 Commonwealth Avenue – Boston, MA 524 CMR A17.1-1996, Part XX 2000.1a(1)

Owner: CommGlen LLC

Petitioner: Paul Warkentin

This petition was placed on hold at the September 29, 2015 meeting until the petitioner could provide the Board with more information from Garaventa USA. The petitioner returned with a representative from Garaventa USA. This petition for variance involves replacing an existing 3-door wheelchair lift (1-W-1072) at 1287 Commonwealth Avenue in Boston. The proposed wheelchair lift replacement has three stops and each stop requires a door on different sides. A motion was put forth by Harry McGonagle to grant this petition under A17.1-1996 Part XX 2000.1a (1), to allow this unit to have three openings. The motion was seconded by David Gaudet.

4. 2941 Acushnet Avenue - New Bedford, MA

524 CMR 32.06 (3)

Owner: Trucchi's Supermarket

Petitioner: Above and Beyond Elevator

The petitioner returned before the Board. The petitioner withdrew his petition for variance from 524 CMR 32.06 (1). The petitioner came before the Board requesting a variance for the bottom gates on the PFLOW VRC (ID# 201-V-530). The issue with the bottom level gate is the 6 inches from the front edge of the car. A motion was put forth by David Gaudet to accept the variance withdrawal from 524 CMR 32.06 (1) for the top door height and allow 6-inch measurement instead of 5-inches as mentioned in 524 CMR 32.06 (3) with an additional safety requirement to fully enclose the gate on the hoistway side. The motion was seconded by Cheri Davis.
