The petitioner came before the Board seeking relief from a DPS Inspector's report dated August 25, 2015. The unit is located at "1 Plastics Avenue – Pittsfield, MA" and was cited for (1) "Top of Car Hoistway Construction" (2) Hoistway not Fire-rated" (3) "No Hoistway vent" The petitioners stated that the structure around the subject elevator should not be considered a "Hoistway" because it does not pass through any floors. A motion was put forth by David Gaudet to grant relief from the Inspector's Report under A17.1-1992 § 35 Parts 100.1a and 100.4 as it relates to fire rating and venting because the unit does not penetrate a floor. The material lift complies with ANSI A17.1 and 524 CMR 32.00 in all parts except for the minimum 72 inch door height at each landing. The material lift was designed to fit the existing hoistway at 374 Commonwealth Avenue in Boston. A motion was put forth by David Morgan to grant the variance from 524 CMR 32.06 to allow 60-inch door height at each landing under the condition that signage is installed to alert workers of the reduced height. The petitioner came before the Board seeking a variance to allow his customer to lower the capacity of an existing freight elevator with State ID #149-F-50 and #149-F-51. The platform size for #149-F-50 is 7'-9' width, 9'-10'' depth with 76.2 square feet. The minimum capacity requirement under ASME A17.1-2004 § 2.162.1 for Class A loading would be 3,810 pounds. The platform size for #149-F-51 is 7'-9'' width, 9'-3'' depth with 72 square feet. The minimum capacity requirement under ASME A17.1-2004 § 2.162.1 for Class A loading would be 3,600 pounds. The petitioner is requesting that the capacity for #149-P-50 be lowered from 6,000 pounds to 4000 pounds.
