## **BOARD OF REVIEW DECISION**

## Introduction and Procedural History of this Appeal

The claimant appeals a decision by a review examiner of the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA), which found the claimant monetarily ineligible for an unemployment claim in Massachusetts, because the services that he performed did not meet the requirements of G.L. c. 151A, § 3. We review, pursuant to our authority under G.L. c. 151A, § 41, and affirm.

On October 26, 2016, the agency determined that the claimant was not monetarily eligible for a claim in Massachusetts. The claimant appealed, and only the claimant attended the hearing. In a decision rendered on February 28, 2018, the review examiner affirmed the agency determination, concluding that the claimant's services were not employment pursuant to G.L. c. 151A, § 3. Because the claimant had no wages from any other employment upon which to base a Massachusetts unemployment claim, the review examiner concluded that the claimant was not monetarily eligible for a claim pursuant to G.L. c. 151A, §§ 24(a) and 1(a).

The claimant timely appealed the review examiner's decision to the Board of Review. However, a processing error beyond the control of the Board prevented the Board from accepting review, denying review, or otherwise issuing a decision in this matter pursuant to the provisions of G.L. c. 151A, § 41.<sup>1</sup> The error was fixed in early 2020, and the Board is now able to decide the claimant's appeal. In so doing, we accept the claimant's timely application for review.

## Ruling of the Board

After considering the recorded testimony and evidence from the hearing, the review examiner's decision, and the claimant's appeal, we conclude that the review examiner's decision is based on substantial evidence and is free from any error of law affecting substantive rights.

The review examiner's decision is affirmed. The claimant is monetarily ineligible for the claim filed with an effective date of October 26, 2016.
