## Introduction and Procedural History of this Appeal

The claimant appeals a decision by a review examiner of the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) to deny the claimant benefits after her separation from the employer on October 22, 2020. We review, pursuant to our authority under G.L. c. 151A, § 41, and affirm.

On May 15, 2021, the agency initially determined that the claimant was not entitled to unemployment benefits. The claimant appealed and both parties attended the hearing. In a decision rendered on September 3, 2021, the review examiner affirmed the agency determination, concluding that the claimant voluntarily left employment without good cause attributable to the employer or urgent, compelling, and necessitous reasons and, thus, was disqualified under G.L. c. 151A, § 25(e)(1). The Board accepted the claimant's application for review.

## Ruling of the Board

After considering the recorded testimony and evidence from the hearing, the review examiner's decision, and the claimant's appeal, we conclude that the review examiner's decision to deny benefits beginning on October 18, 2020, is based on substantial evidence and is free from any error of law affecting substantive rights. However, information contained in the DUA's UI Online System shows that the claimant's indefinite disqualification is no longer warranted, as she earned sufficient wages through the second quarter of 2021 to monetarily requalify her for benefits as of June 20, 2021. Based on the above, we are implementing an end date of June 19, 2021, to the claimant's disqualification in this matter.
