Introduction and Procedural History of this Appeal

The claimant appeals a decision by a review examiner of the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) to deny benefits beginning on May 28, 2023. We review, pursuant to our authority under G.L. c. 151A, § 41, and affirm.

On July 14, 2023, the agency initially determined that the claimant was not entitled to unemployment benefits. The claimant appealed and attended the hearing. In a decision rendered on September 9, 2023, the review examiner affirmed the agency determination, concluding that the claimant was not available for work as of May 28, 2023, and, thus, was disqualified under G.L. c. 151A, § 24(b). The Board accepts the claimant's application for review.

Ruling of the Board

After considering the recorded testimony and evidence from the hearing, the review examiner's decision, and the claimant's appeal, we conclude that the review examiner's decision to disqualify the claimant pursuant to G.L. c. 151A, § 24(b), is based on substantial evidence and is free from any error of law affecting substantive rights.

However, the information contained in the DUA's electronic record-keeping system, UI Online, and the exhibits show that the claimant's training program, which was the only circumstance restricting the claimant's availability, ended on September 15, 2023. Accordingly, we will implement an end date of September 16, 2023, to the claimant's disqualification under G.L. c. 151A, § 24(b).

The review examiner's decision is affirmed. The claimant is denied benefits between May 28, 2023, and September 16, 2023.
