Introduction and Procedural History of this Appeal

The employer appeals a decision by a review examiner of the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) to award the claimant benefits following her separation from employment on September 19, 2024. We review, pursuant to our authority under G.L. c. 151A, § 41, and affirm.

On February 13, 2025, the agency initially determined that the claimant was entitled to unemployment benefits. The employer appealed, and both parties attended the hearing. In a decision rendered on August 7, 2025, the review examiner affirmed the agency determination, concluding that the employer had not shown the claimant engaged in deliberate misconduct in wilful disregard of the employer's interest or knowingly violated a reasonable and uniformly enforced rule or policy of the employer and, thus, was not disqualified under G.L. c. 151A, § 25(e)(2).

Ruling of the Board

After considering the recorded testimony and evidence from the hearing, the review examiner's decision, and the employer's appeal, we conclude that the review examiner's decision is based on substantial evidence and is free from any error of law affecting substantive rights. We further note that the instant employer is not a base period employer, meaning that the wages paid by this employer are not used in calculating her weekly benefit amount and this employer is not being charged under her 2024-01 claim for benefits.

The review examiner's decision is affirmed. The claimant is entitled to receive benefits for the week of September 15, 2025, and for subsequent weeks if otherwise eligible.
