## Introduction and Procedural History of this Appeal

The claimant appeals a decision by a review examiner of the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) to deny the claimant Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) benefits in connection with a claim filed in Massachusetts, effective April 5, 2020. We review, pursuant to our authority under G.L. c. 151A, § 41, and affirm.

On November 13, 2020, the agency determined that the claimant was not entitled to PUA benefits. The claimant appealed and attended the hearing. In a decision rendered on February 23, 2021, the review examiner affirmed the agency determination, concluding that the claimant did not show that COVID-19 caused his unemployment or that he was working in Massachusetts in 2020 and, thus, he was ineligible for PUA benefits under § 2102 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020. The Board accepted the claimant's application for review.

## Ruling of the Board

After considering the recorded testimony and evidence from the hearing, the review examiner's decision, and the claimant's appeal, we conclude that the review examiner's decision to deny benefits, is based on substantial evidence and is free from any error of law affecting substantive rights, because the claimant did not show a connection to Massachusetts at the time he filed his PUA claim.

The review examiner's decision is affirmed. The claimant is denied PUA benefits under his Massachusetts PUA claim for the week ending April 11, 2020.

Because the record indicates that the claimant, a Rhode Island resident, may have become unable to work because children in the household for whom the claimant has primary caregiving responsibility were unable to attend schools that were closed as a direct result of the COVID-19 public health emergency, he may be eligible to file a PUA claim in Rhode Island.
